From Synod Bishop Terry Brandt

I am writing to inform you that I have accepted an offer to serve as Vice President of Advancement at Concordia College in Moorhead, MN. My last day of serving as your bishop will be January 14. It was a surprise to me when I was notified I had been nominated for consideration and it has certainly surprised me the process has resulted in a new call coming my way.

I am grateful to Presiding Bishop Eaton for the wonderful support during my time of discernment. With the Synod Council, an Interim Bishop has already been appointed: Larry Wohlrabe, former Bishop to Northwestern Minnesota Synod.

It has been an honor to serve among you for the past twelve years—first as Associate with the Bishop and for the last six years as your Bishop. This announcement brings a multitude of emotions as names, faces and wonderful ministry moments are running through my mind. This has been a call of a lifetime and I am grateful.

I leave with a sense of accomplishment in many things and also a longing for some things left undone. That being said, I know if I felt like everything was accomplished, I probably would have stayed too long. My friends, just as God is up to something new in my life, the same is true for Eastern North Dakota Synod. Eastern North Dakota is an amazing synod. Whatever challenges may lie ahead pale in comparison to the abundant opportunities to continue living out the mission statement to “life in love as we serve, equip and challenge God’s people.” God is faithful and has provided committed, engaged and creative leaders, both rostered and lay, all across this synod.

I thank God for each of you and will miss partnering with you.

I leave with a deep appreciation for the Synod staff. They are good and faithful people who are committed to gospel work on behalf of the entire synod. They will continue to serve you extremely well.

Please know I will use my last weeks of service doing whatever I can to end well and pass the baton to Interim Bishop Wohlrabe and a new bishop to be elected in June. I invite you to join me in moving into this unknown future trusting and believing we are led by the promises of God, the presence of Jesus Christ, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Council Notes 12-16-19 Mtg

Carols & Cocoa event with Walhalla-Big Pembina Lutheran Parish on December 15 went over well at Frost Fire, with about 40 in attendance.

Endowment will take \$5,500 from this year's interest. \$5,000 will go towards redoing the parsonage driveway and \$500 towards the Cavalier County Cancer Crusaders.

With the HVAC, there are still some loose ends to complete due to work delays, so we will not see full cost-saving benefits this year.

Harvest Sunday dedicated offering was \$7,875.

After further checking, all of the ELCA recommended updates to our constitution can be made at our annual meeting.

2020 budget was approved to recommend at the annual meeting. It is \$20,000 less than 2019's budget (which will not be met, although we will end the year in the black).

Nominating committee is still seeking to fill several positions in advance of the annual meeting in January: property (1), stewardship (2), nominating (3), education (1).

Full Council minutes, treasurers reports and pastors' reports are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

“Discover Islam” Documentary

Imagine that you and your family are moving to a remote Asian village, where you will set up a health clinic under the sponsorship of your denomination. You quickly recognize that the local people with whom you will live and work not only are ignorant about Christianity but hold some negative stereotypes toward it. You begin to create learning resources to explain the Christian religion to them. You recognize that you should feature the diversity of Christian practice around the world. You want even to acknowledge the occasional misuse of the tradition by extremist groups such as the Ku Klux Klan and cults such as the Branch Davidians. But mainly you want to help your new community understand your own Christian faith and how it shapes your life and motivates your work.

The producers of the documentary series Discover Islam had very similar goals, as expressed in these words: "There are over a billion and a half people across the globe that claim to be followers of Islam. Yet few people outside the faith truly understand Muslim beliefs, practices and values. There is great misinformation about issues ranging from jihad to women's rights. These documentaries aim to remedy this situation."

This January and February, our Sunday morning adult Bible studies will explore this six-part award-winning documentary. Only in better understanding others, can we understand ourselves. Join us for video and conversation in the church library, these Sundays at 9am:
