Standing on Holy Land

A few weeks ago while in the Black Hills, I reflected on "holy land" on my personal Facebook page. It was good to reflect about something not related to the many issues we're currently wrestling with today! As I share and expand on that below, I pray that it will be as helpful reading as it was for me to write...

Holy land.

Billions of people have called present day Israel and Palestine the Holy Land. It is the land which King David ruled, where Jesus walked and where Mohammed is said to have ascended into heaven. It is a land which has been fought over for religious and geographic reasons.

For millennia, the Black Hills have been sacred to the First Peoples of North America. It has been an oasis in the prairie, a pilgrimage for hunting and spiritual renewal.

Atlantic Mountain Ranch (AMR) is my "holy land" in the Black Hills. It is where I worked five summers in outdoor ministry, where I met my wife, rejuvenated my faith, found lasting friendships and more. A few years ago, Lutheran Outdoors in South Dakota made the difficult decision to end programming at AMR and to sell the land.

While in the Black Hills most recently, I drove to the entry of AMR and took a picture. It is still a holy place for me. The land was sacred long before I stepped foot on it. But what makes it holy for me? My experiences tied to it.

What are your holy places? Where have you been touched in an amazing, humbling and life-changing way? Perhaps our church building is a holy place for you, or land your family has farmed for generations or somewhere as simple as your back yard.

My guess is, there are thousands of these holy places. The whole earth is, after all, holy. I thank my Creator for this earth and for opportunities to experience the majesty of our Maker through this earth. I give thanks for friendships, for experiences and life itself.

Wherever you are, whatever places you hold as special, may we all give thanks. And in giving thanks, may we remember that our God is good!

*Please note, our total yearly income includes \$17,400 from the federal government's Payroll Protection Program (PPP) and this is not considered offering income. Please note that **without the PPP money received, we would be approximately \$5,841 in the red.** This money is short-term assistance and cannot replace the giving from ULC households. Thank you for your continued financial gifts, whatever their size, during this time of economic uncertainty.

Endowment

As of July 29, our Endowment Fund balance was \$109,496.13. If you would like to make a contribution to the United Lutheran Church Endowment Fund, please make checks payable to "InFaith Foundation" (which manages our endowment fund).

Council Notes 07-22-20 Mtg

July income was up due to a few sizable yearly donations. The PPP loan has all been used.

Education committee is exploring Sunday school options and will know more when the school district plan is released.

Linda Dahl has requested to go off the Hospitality committee; the Nominating committee will be asked to find someone to fill her term.

The parsonage dishwasher has been replaced and paid from the parsonage repair budget line.

Stewardship committee has been visiting about God's Work, Our Hands with Covid-19 in mind.

Council authorized council president and pastor to decide on a weekly basis whether in-person worship should be suspended, based on active Covid-19 cases in our area.

Park River Bible Camp is asking for financial assistance. Council approved sending \$500 of our budgeted \$1,000 PRBC line item to the camp now, with the remainder possibly later in the year.

Discussion about technology upgrades for online worship. Steve Hart will help setup. Council approved up to \$1,500 from the music fund for initial equipment expenses.

Council minutes, treasurers reports and pastors' reports are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

Synod Assembly

Due to Covid-19 concerns, the 2020 Eastern North Dakota Synod assembly will be held remotely, August 14-16. Pastor Karl, Lisa Schuler and Linda Timian will be our “virtual” reps. One of the primary business items will be the election of a new synod bishop. The slate of nominees for our Eastern North Dakota Synod’s next bishop, who will be included on the first ballot, are:

As we worship in person during this time of Covid-19, we continue to balance the physical, spiritual and emotional health of those who choose to gather in-person. These steps are based on recommendations from the CDC, ND Public Health and ELCA synod and church wide resources. As you can see in the schedule above, we are resuming Holy Communion distribution during July, but otherwise still do not have food or beverage at church.
