Kyrie Eleison—Lord, Have Mercy

Kyrie eleison is a Latin phrase which is part of our liturgy, meaning “Lord, have mercy.” It is usually sung in our liturgy, but—during this time of Covid—we have instead been speaking the Kyrie.

It may be awhile before normal returns, and even then, experts predict it may be a “new normal.”

Special Congregational Meeting

There will be a **Special Meeting of the United Lutheran Church Congregation** after worship Sunday, **December 6**, to approve striking the following paragraph from our bylaws:

United Women shall elect one representative from their organization to regularly attend all Council meetings to act as a liaison between their organization and Council. This member shall have all the duties and responsibilities of a Council member including voting rights.

This amendment was brought to the Church Council at the request of our United Women circle leaders. If approved December 6, it will then require ratification at our January 24 Annual Meeting of the Congregation. If we are unable to meet in-person for either meeting, our bylaws allow us to vote electronically.

Council Notes 09-21-20 Mtg

ULC has applied for and received a ND economic resiliency grant which will be used toward hand sanitizer stations in the church building.

Samson Electric has been installing off-peak metering for the church building.

Sunday school schedule is finalized with precautionary Covid plans in place. Thrivent Action Team money has been used to purchase a large-screen TV for mounting in the fellowship hall.

There was discussion about needs to the church facility and both weekly and annual church maintenance needs.

Council approved recommendations for amending church bylaws to strike United Women from having a church council representative. This will need approval by the congregation, at a special meeting December 6 and our January 24 annual meeting.

Council made a motion to attempt to sell the church van.

Council minutes, treasurers reports and pastors' reports are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

Sunday School

Greetings and Happy Fall!

As we approach the start of our Sunday School year, the Education Committee has been working to ensure that things go smoothly and we wanted to share some of the information with all of you so we are set for our first day.

First, a reminder that SS will begin at 9:15 this year with our first day being October 4th. The kids will meet in the fellowship hall as usual. SS will dismiss at 9:50. We ask that kids do not bring any treats or snacks to SS and a reminder to wash up well before coming to church if you've had any peanut butter items for breakfast.

Some changes due to Covid-19: Kids will be asked to bring masks to SS. Once we are all seated at our tables, we will determine if they need to wear them during class time depending on attendance. We will be keeping kids in groups by class, very similar to how they are grouped at school. Again, please make sure your child has a mask before arriving at SS. We will also be asking the children to sanitize their hands before coming into the fellowship hall at our sanitizing station in the entry way.

We will be following the school's quarantine policy - if your child is quarantined from school, they will be quarantined from SS as well. In addition, if the school decides to distance learn for a period of time, our SS won't meet in person either. Please watch our Facebook page for those announcements.

This year, we are asking that our Student Registration form is filled out for ALL kids, regardless of grade, as we haven't updated them recently. This can be found on our Sunday School Facebook page or at the church office. Feel free to print that off and send it with your child on the first day of SS or drop it off at the church office.

We are excited to begin our Sunday School year and have the kids back in the church! If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out. We look forward to seeing you all soon!

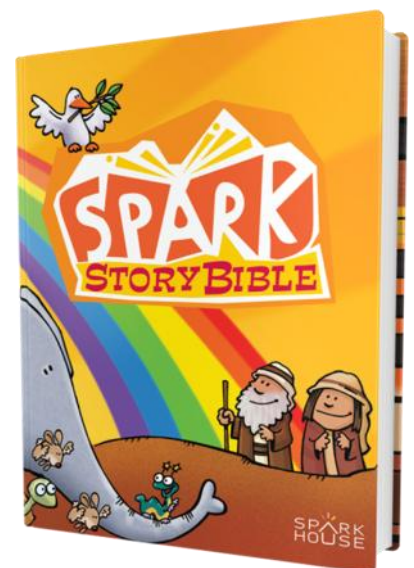


Bibles for Three-year-olds

Youth Food Pantry Event

This year, instead of youth meeting at the Paragon and carpooling around town to collect food, we will be raising money for the Cavalier County Emergency Food Pantry. We will NOT be collecting food door-to-door, although food donations may be brought to church.

Instead, the evening of October 28, youth at ULC and at other Langdon churches will receive educational information about hunger issues in general and related to our community. Youth whose church has no adult leaders are welcome to join with another church for the evening.

Youth will then contact people by phone/text, seeking donations. We will have a script for them to use. They can contact people in their contact list or of church members. Let’s see how much support Langdon area youth can raise for the food pantry!

Financial donations may be made in two ways: by mail or online. If mailed, checks can be made to the CC Emergency Food Pantry and mailed to PO Box 630, in Langdon. Online donations will be given through PayPal; stay tuned for their web link!

Sandy Almlie Update

September 21, 2020

Hi, Family and Friends,

Well, today did not go as planned. Lisa was supposed to take mom to meet with her oncologist today at 1:00. Instead, she picked her up at 10:00am and drove her to St. John's ER. Mom has struggled for the past month or so with some delusions and this past week they became pretty significant. She also started to get very confused and struggled to comprehend what was going on around her. She had a UTI (urinary tract infection), which we had initially thought was the cause of her diminished mental state, but the penicillin did not help. We were hoping that the UTI had not been cleared with the antibiotics, but all her labs today came back normal. So, she is spending the night at St. John's while they investigate further. She will also have her lung drained again tomorrow as it was full of fluid and she was breathing heavy with even minimal exertion.

We spoke to her oncologist late in the day. Her brain showed no sign of cancer and thus far the cancer has not moved past the lung chamber. However, given her marked weakness and her multitude of health complications along with her current mental state, he is recommending hospice.

We will keep you posted as we learn more tomorrow and always, now more than ever.
