All committees have had organizational meetings to welcome new committee members and look at the upcoming year.

Coffee after Sunday church services will resume March 7.

## Lent and Easter

United Lutheran has begun midweek Lenten services at 7:00 pm each Wednesday and also on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Our hope is to offer these both in-person and on Facebook.

Our midweek Lenten theme is “You Shall Love the Lord Your God.” Each week has a different focus on how we can love the Lord our God with all our hearts, our souls, our minds and our strength.

Offerings for our midweek Lenten services will go to the Cavalier County Ministerial Association which provides emergency financial support to people in need in our community. Support includes rental and utility assistance, short-term lodging and transportation. Most of the ministerial funding is generally raised through the ecumenical community Lenten services which we are not having this year. Thank you for your generosity.

Pending Council approving, United Lutheran is planning to have their 8AM Traditional Easter Worship service, 10AM Contemporary Easter Worship service on April 4.

## Haiti Mission and Ministry Update

Connection is at the heart of Seeds of Support, our partner in ministry with Haiti. Our desire has always been to accompany our Haitian partners to help them achieve their goals, and through the years of that accompaniment work, strong connections are bearing fruit. Even in this time of social distancing, with no travel opportunities to connect face-to-face, we are figuring out ways to connect virtually and help implement projects that have the potential for lasting change both within and beyond Redemption Lutheran Church of Pasquette.

In January, a bench-building class was provided in Pasquette, with nine students attending. The benches will be used in the Pasquette church or Ideas Technology School sessions. Additionally, learning to build the benches is a transferable skill to other woodworking projects. To further support potential employment opportunities, Seeds of Support is gifting each student with tools of the trade (saw, hammer, square, etc.).

Our translator/mission support staff member, Joseph shares that he has started a small business selling refurbished cell phones. Especially with the uncertainties around COVID-19 and the challenges of life in Haiti right now, he is grateful for the continued support and partnership from Seeds of Support. He shares a few words about his current situation and future hopes below:

**What are you doing these days?** *I always thinking and to make a new stuff. Like a different kind of jewelry. I also do like football and I go to play some time.*

**Where do you see God present in your life?** *I see God present in prayer and sometimes you can feel it when you are singing too!*

**What are your hopes for the future?** *I am just thinking to working more harder and to get my own place. God knows everything!*

Please pray:

- for Kerlange, Pastor Holande, and Jorel's mother, navigating health challenges;
- for the people of Haiti for safety and protection from COVID-19;
- for peace and calm during political uncertainty in Haiti.

Thank you for your continued support of St. Andrew and United's work in Haiti. We are excited about the energy around our mission both among our board and our Haitian partners. God is presenting, with and through us and we wait in hope to see God's plans for the future.
