The Reformation: Why It Still Matters

The reformation led by Martin Luther, whom after United Lutheran and all Lutheran churches world-wide are named after, happened a long time ago. So why should it still matter to followers of Jesus today? Simply stated, the reformation was a movement to get back to the basics of the faith. Luther stressed the basics by developing the small catechism which we still use for confirmation instruction. He stressed the importance of God's Word for personal devotion and public worship. He did this so that everyone could hear and reflect upon the good news of salvation offered to all people through the death and resurrection of Jesus; and what that meant for our lives as people of faith.

Think about it this way: Any athlete in any sport to rise to a competitive level needs to "practice the basics". Fans go to the games. What we don't see as fans is the hours of practice devoted to the basics so that an athlete can get better and better and become a master of his or her sport in order to defeat the competition.

That is the essence of why the reformation should matter to us all as followers of Jesus. We need to focus on the basics of faith so they become natural for us in the way we live our lives. So that we are not defeated by the brokenness of this world, (the terms Luther would have used were sin, death and the devil).

What are those basics:

Love God by worshipping Him on a regular basis. This is the first, greatest commandment according to Jesus. In other words, the most basic of all the basics.

Serve God by using your gifts and talents, both in your church and in your community. Jesus said, "I have come not to be served but to serve" and by implication this is an expectation of all who follow Him. The second part of the great commandment of Jesus also refers to this basic Christian practice, "Love God and Love One Another".

Work at forgiveness as we have been forgiven and it's central to who we are as God's people. As we pray in the Lord's prayer, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us".

Make prayer central to your life. Put yourself in God's presence in order to speak and listen to God.

The Reformation still matters because it makes us focus on the basics of our faith. Also, to work on getting better and better in the high calling in becoming a son or daughter of God.

God Bless the people of United Lutheran for running the race of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus and to run your race with a focus on loving God and serving Him! As you focus on the basics, you will win the race!

Council Notes 09-20-21 Mtg




Sunday School
