Greetings from Pastor Jodi

Greeting Brothers and Sisters in Christ at United Lutheran. I was asked to tell you a little bit about myself prior to my arrival at United.

I am the eldest child of the late Ardell and Mavis Naas. I have two brothers and one sister and grew up on a farm near Kloten, North Dakota. I was a member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church of rural Kloten until I married. I graduated from McVillage High School which is now a part of the Dakota Prairie School District.

I attended Jamestown College and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Nursing and a minor in psychology. My nursing career started in Northwood, ND where I worked as a graduate nurse and then spent 15 years working in Fargo at Dakota Heartland as an RN. First as a staff nurse in pediatrics and later as a nurse manager of pediatrics and the intensive care nursery. I met my husband, Paul, during this time and after getting married, moved to Edmore and worked as an RN in pediatrics at Altru in Grand Forks. One of my friends introduced me to parish nursing and I became a Faith Community Nurse in 2003. I started as a volunteer parish nurse, providing education, screenings and visitation to nursing homes and shut ins. My parish nurse role evolved into doing lay ministry and pulpit supply which I had been introduced to at Our Savior's. Occasionally, I would be asked to fill in when the pastor was on vacation during my senior year of high school and college.

My love for ministry increased and the Holy Spirit led me to seek an alternative route to ordained ministry. Through TEEM

(Theological Education for Emerging Ministry), I was able to pursue my seminary education through a merged program between Luther Seminary in St. Paul and Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, California. TEEM is a program that is designed for individuals who are already serving as a lay minister in a church setting, and who are lifted up by their Bishop and congregation as a candidate for the program. The three year program allows an individual to continue ministry in their current setting during their educational process. Upon completion of the program, their current setting assumes that the candidate will be called to that setting and ordained. I have served as a lay minister in the High Plains Ministry, a seven point parish including; Nekoma, Fairdale, Edmore, Adams, Lawton, Brocket and Doyon for seven years; followed by 10 years of ordained ministry.

Council Notes 09-20-21 Mtg

Carla reported that Sunday school attendance has been great and Lisa has started practice for the Christmas program. Confirmation students will be involved with the Trick or Treat Food Drive and also Thanksgiving baskets.

Steve reported the basement flooring at the parsonage is complete. Deflectors for air placement will be ordered for the vents on the wall units in the sanctuary. The roof project at the parsonage will begin soon.
