# Council Notes 12-20-21 Mtg

A Covid protocol update, Council voted to begin passing the offering plates during worship services. Annual committee reports are due at the end of December. The Annual Meeting will be held after worship on January 30 and there will be a vote on a few by-law & constitution changes. Council made a motion to approve the 2022 Annual Budget. Pastor Jodi's installation date will be January 9 with a light reception following worship. The bishop of the END Synod will be present.

# Annual Congregational Meeting

United Lutheran Church will hold its annual meeting of the congregation after worship on Sunday, January 30 (please note this change of date). Your presence is important; bring a dish to share for our potluck following the meeting! A few rough drafts of the annual report will be available the Sunday prior to the meeting.

Our meeting will include looking back at the 2021 calendar year, looking ahead to 2022, approving the church budget, nominations for committee and council members, voting on updates to our constitution as recommended by our Council.

## Constitution and Bylaws Update

President Deidre Long and Pastor Jodi have reviewed the current Constitution and By-laws of United Lutheran. They have discovered a few discrepancies and duplications in the documents. The ELCA Model Constitution that was adopted in 2019 contains many of the items in the current by-laws; therefore, certain line items can and should be changed in the by-laws for consistency and clarity. Church Council has decided to address this at the annual meeting and a vote will take place to amend the by-laws to meet this need. Copies, highlighting these changes will be available on the church bulletin board at the east entrance of the sanctuary and hallway bulletin board by the women's bathroom through the month of January.
