

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. Galatians 5:22-23

Have you noticed that in these summer months after Pentecost, green is the dominant color seen in the church...paraments, banners, vestments and green will remain for the majority of the Fall as well. The green season is a "growing time" because this is the portion of our faith year when we focus...through Bible readings and prayers...on how we can grow as Christians to be more like Jesus. This is when we think...both personally and as a faith community...about what it means to "be Christ in the world". What it means to share kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, peace, joy, love and self-control...the Fruits of the Spirit...with each other and the world around us. This is also a time to evaluate how growing these fruits, changes our daily lives and effects our everyday choices.

As of August 2, our Endowment Fund balance was \$96,750.16. If you would like to make a contribution to the Endowment Fund, please make checks payable to "InFaith Foundation" (which manages our endowment fund). Interest accrued yearly from this Endowment fund has been used at the end of each year to give back to needs within our community or special projects within the church.

Council Notes 07-18-22 Mtg

Dan Fischer presented documentation reflecting land on the west and south side of the church property, approximately 1/2 acre, which is being gifted by the Downs family. Eventually, the two tracts of land will be merged into one.

The Stewardship Committee has voted to order a lock box to use for weekly contribution collections.

There will be a youth event on August 2 at Mt. Carmel Dam for an evening of fun for the youth.

The Education Committee will be meeting regarding fall Sunday school plans.

Tyler reported that the endowment balance has dipped close to \$4,000 since last month.

Property is still waiting for bids for a small grate to be placed outside the north entrance to alleviate water seeping in the front entrance. Also, they are waiting on bids for possibly tearing off the siding from the south side of the sanctuary to evaluate the leaks between the wall of the fellowship hall and sanctuary.

Council voted to begin locking the east entrance for safety concerns. Other churches are having to lock their doors required by their insurance companies. Security cameras will be purchased and placed at the door entrances. The church property safety assessment has yet to be scheduled; waiting for finalization from the other community churches.

Council minutes and treasurers reports are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

Sunday School Coordinator

We are still looking for a volunteer(s) to fill the Sunday school coordinator position. If interested in this vital role in our congregation and ministry, please talk with Carla Gemmill. Some of the duties would include: **July** - working with the Education Committee to secure teachers for the upcoming Sunday school year, plan and order with the help of Pastor Jodi/Julie the curriculum for the upcoming year and set teaching schedule. **August** - hold teacher meeting to go over details/schedule. Send out reminders each week on who is teaching so subs can be found if needed. (Education committee will cover some of this too).

Coordinate with music instructor to plan the Christmas program. Assign roles, organize costumes, help rehearse, etc. (Can form a committee to split up these duties). Help organize fall/spring service projects for the kids.

Mental Health Awareness

The United Lutheran Church Council is taking an active step in promoting mental health awareness. You will notice that posters have been placed on bulletin boards throughout the church providing information about mental health. Information regarding support groups, suicide prevention and mental health awareness will be included in our bulletins and newsletters. Why??? Mental Health Illness has been skyrocketing in the United States. Mental health includes our emotional, psychological and social well-being and affects how we think, feel and act. It also helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others and make choices. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood through adulthood. In fact, studies show that approximately 53 million people in the United States live with a mental illness, which is about 21% of the adult population (about 1 in 5 people). Mental illness in youth between 6-17 years old follows close behind at 17% (about 1 in 6 people). Suicide is a leading cause of death in the United States and is the 2nd leading cause of death for people ages 10-24. Suicide accounted for the loss of more than 45,979 American lives in 2020, nearly double the number of lives lost to homicide. Tune in next month for more news. Let's stop the stigma that prevents people from getting the help they need.

National Crisis Hotline - On July 16, 2022, the U.S. transitioned to using the 988 dialing code for a direct connection to compassionate, accessible care and support for anyone experiencing mental health-related distress - whether that is thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis or any other kind of emotional distress. Anyone can also dial 988 if they are worried about a loved one who may need crisis support.

On Jul 8, 2022, the FDA granted another three-month shelf-life extension for the iHealth COVID-19 Antigen Rapid Test, which extended the shelf-life of all iHealth tests from 6 months to 12 months.

Free at home test kits are available from public health, the emergency manager, Langdon Prairie Health, Langdon Drug, Munich Grocery, CHS Milton, Mt. Carmel Rec Area and Calvin Farmers Union.
